- Home to 210,000 residents
- Capital and largest city of Rhineland-Palatinate
- At the heart of the vibrant Rhine-Main area
- At close distance to the cities of Frankfurt, Wiesbaden and Darmstadt
- Historic wine-growing region and part of the network "Great Wine Capitals"
- Headquarter of Germany's second-largest TV station (ZDF).
- Close to Germany's largest airport at Frankfurt

Johannes Gutenberg University (JGU) Mainz (contd.)

- Nearly all departments located on one single campus
- Approx. 4,400 academics, including 560 professors, teach and research in over 150 institutes and clinics
- More than 100 partner universities worldwide
- JGU is a member of "German U15", an association of 15 research-intensive German universities













Life on campus

The campus of JGU Mainz ...

- provides students with a place to study, research and live
- offers a wide range of politically and socially active university groups
- offers student accommodation, bars, restaurants, cafés and even a KlubKino cinema

(Exchange students applying in due time are guaranteed a room in the students' residences)













Further benefits for students at JGU Mainz

- Huge selection of (usually) free sports activities offered by the university sports center
- Free computer use and internet access on campus
- Student discounts, e.g. for tickets of the local football club (FSV Mainz 05, playing in the Bundesliga) and of the Mainz State theatre
- Low-priced food on campus at several dining halls and cafeterias
- Semester ticket allowing to use public transport in Mainz, Frankfurt and the Rhine-Main area

Support of foreign students (contd.)

Student Services (Studierendenwerk)

- Buddy program: Brings together German and international students to promote cultural exchange and thereby offers a great opportunity to meet other students
- Foreigners become friends: Allows witnessing the everyday life of "regular" citizens away from campus to obtain deeper insights into the host country

AEGEE

- interdisciplinary organization
- organizes activities, excursions and city trips
- offers informal chats and drinks at weekly regulars' table ("Stammtisch")

Is it expensive to live in Mainz?

You should generally calculate approx. 700 euros per month to cover your accomodation, semester fee (319,15 euros, also covering public transport), rent, food, clothes, health insurance and other expenses

Dormitory rent	€ 300
Health insurance	€ 70
Everyday expenditures	€ 330

Of course, the amount you actually spend depends on the standards you are used to...













Academic calendar

Winter Term: October 1 - March 31

Lecture Period: mid-October to mid-February

Summer Term: April 1 – September 30 Lecture Period: mid-April to mid-July

Regular courses and lectures are only held during the lecture period













Language requirements

- As an exchange student you do not need an official certificate of your German language skills to enrol
- However, it is recommended to speak and understand some German to establish contacts with your fellow students, get along in daily life etc.
- ISSK (JGU's language centre) offers German courses which are especially designed for international students
